## Background

- DE LATHRON
- Policy development is a key part of the League of California Cities (League) effectiveness.
- The League holds an Annual Conference and Business Meeting to decide League policy for the upcoming year.
- The Annual Conference will be held at the SAFE Credit Union Convention Center in Sacramento, September 22–24, 2021.

### Background (cont.)



- The League's Annual Conference Resolutions is one way that city officials can directly participate in the development of League policy.
- Council action is required to designate a voting delegate (and up to two alternates) in order to participate in the Business Meeting.
- Each member City has the right to cast one vote on matter pertaining to League policy.

### Background (cont.)



- Conference registration required.
- The approximate cost per person is estimated at \$1,500 per person:
  - League Registration \$550 (before July 16) / \$660 (after July 16)
  - Hotel/Transportation/Other \$840

 Currently, \$5,000 is available in the new Fiscal Year 21-22, budget for City Council training & travel expenses throughout the fiscal year.

**RESOLUTION OF THE LEAGUE OF CALIFORNIA CITIES ("CAL** 1 CITIES") CALLING ON THE STATE LEGISLATURE TO PASS LEGISLATION THAT PROVIDES FOR A FAIR AND EQUITABLE DISTRIBUTION OF THE BRADLEY BURNS 1% LOCAL SALES TAX FROM IN-STATE ONLINE PURCHASES, BASED ON DATA WHERE PRODUCTS ARE SHIPPED TO, AND THAT RIGHTFULLY TAKES INTO CONSIDERATION THE IMPACTS THAT FULFILLMENT CENTERS HAVE ON HOST CITIES BUT ALSO PROVIDES A FAIR SHARE TO CALIFORNIA CITIES THAT DO NOT AND/OR CANNOT HAVE A FULFILLMENT CENTER WITHIN THEIR JURISDICTION
