Now that we have three active K9s, I believe we need to make sure our K9 partners are protected, not only today but after they stop working.

- 1. Can you share our policy on aftercare when these dogs retire, or heaven forbid, get hurt?
- 2. Will the city allow the K9 to stay on the vet insurance and let the handler pay the monthly bill, or whoever takes ownership?
- 3. What is our policy for retiring them? If the handler wants to promote, will the dog be moved to a new handler, or will the city retire them? What are the minimum years that we will expect a canine to work?
- 4. What is the process and cost for the handler to keep the dog after retirement if they choose to do so?
- 5. What is the policy so a working dog doesn't get sent to a shelter after retirement? Yes, I see it happen monthly!
- 6. Will the city pay for the spay and neutering so the cost doesn't fall on the handler?

I know the dogs are not even six months on the job, but we need to protect them now before they are no longer of value to a city.

And I look forward to getting my questions answered.
