Background



On September 11, 2023, the City Council directed staff to bring back a presentation to further discuss the possibility of adopting regulations related to Hookah Lounges within the City of Lathrop.



Hookah Lounge Definition




- An establishment holding a valid Tobacco Retail License that exclusively occupies an indoor space and is primarily engaged in the retail sale of hookah tobacco for consumption by customers on site.
- Hookah is a device used to smoke tobacco (called shisha).
- A typical hookah has a head, a metal body, a water bowl, and a flexible hose with a mouthpiece that is used to inhale the smoke. In most hookah, hot charcoal is placed on top of the tobacco to heat it.

State Regulations



- Hookah lounges (that meet the definition of a "retail or wholesale tobacco shop" per CA Labor Code 6404.5) are exempt from California's Smoke-free Workplace Law, allowing smoking indoors legal.
- Hookah Lounges are exempt from California's ban on flavored tobacco products (Senate Bill 793).
- The minimum age of sale for tobacco products in CA is 21 (18 for active duty military personnel) There is no minimum age requirement to enter a hookah lounge.
- Tobacco shops are not allowed to sell alcoholic beverages or food for consumption on premises.

Pros and Cons of Hookah



Pros:

- Enjoyed in a group setting as a social hub
- Economic benefit (jobs and sales tax)
- Entertainment options (live music, themed nights, etc.)
- Social and cultural preservation (hookah is deeply ingrained in various cultural traditions)

Pros and Cons of Hookah



Cons:

- Charcoal is used to heat the shisha (can increase health risks: production of carbon monoxide, heavy metals, and cancer-causing chemicals)
- Flavored hookah (apple, peach, strawberry) can appeal to younger demographic
- Second hand smoke

Local Regulations



- Regulations may include:
 - Conditional Use Permit or permitted by-right
 - Limit to specific zoning districts
 - Limit the number of hookah lounges permitted
 - Hours or operation restriction
 - Distance requirements (schools, parks, other hookah lounge)





- San Joaquin County
 - Permitted in Commercial Zoning Districts
- City of Manteca
 - Conditional Use Permit Mixed Use and General Commercial Zoning.
- City of Modesto
 - Permitted Commercial and Industrial Zoning Districts. Conditional Use Permit if associated with on-site alcohol consumption.
- City of Riverbank
 - Conditional Use Permit Neighborhood Commercial with distance requirements – 1,000 ft. from other hookah, 500 ft. from residential, and 600 ft. from schools and parks.

Not permitted in Tracy, Lodi, and Stockton.
