

APPOINTMENT OF VOTING DELEGATE AND ALTERNATE FOR THE 2025 CALCITIES ANNUAL CONFERENCE

Background



- Policy development is a key function of the League of California Cities (CalCities), and a means to support the needs of member cities.
- CalCities holds an Annual Conference and Business Meeting to decide on policy for the upcoming year.
- ▶ The Annual Conference will be held at the Long Beach Convention Center in Long Beach, California, October 8–10, 2025.

Background (cont.)



- The Annual Conference Resolutions is one way that City Officials can directly participate in the development of CalCities policy.
- Each member City has the right to cast one vote on matters pertaining to CalCities policy.
- However, Council action is required to designate a voting delegate (and up to two alternates) in order to participate in the Official Business Meeting.

Background (cont.)



- Conference registration required.
- The approximate cost per person is estimated at \$3,600 per person:
 - League Registration \$675 (register by September 26th)
 - Hotel/Transportation/Other \$2,925

CalCities Resolutions

- The deadline to submit Resolutions by member cities was August 9,2025. As of this morning, there were no Resolutions on the CalCities website.
- However, a petitioned Resolution can still be submitted during the Annual Conference and would need to be considered and voted on during the business meeting.
- The General Resolutions Committee will meet Thursday, October 9th to consider the matters on the agenda and any petitioned resolutions made during the conference.
- Final vote of General Assembly 8:30 a.m., October 10th
