5.1 PUBLIC HEARING (PUBLISHED NOTICE) TO CONSIDER AMENDMENTS TO SECTION 12.04.010 AND SECTION 12.20.010 OF THE LATHROP MUNICIPAL CODE (LMC)

Parks and Recreation Direction Todd Sebastian provided a presentation introducing amendments related to conduct in city parks and prohibited actions. Mayor Akinjo opened the public hearing. With no members of the public wishing to speak, Mayor Akinjo closed the public hearing. A City Council discussion followed. Councilmember Dresser expressed concern that the amendments could limit recreational activities for residents.

Mayor Akinjo stepped down from the dais at 8:36 p.m. and returned at 8:38 p.m.

REVIEW AND CONSIDER TRAFFIC CONTROL OPTIONS FOR RIVER 5.2 ISLANDS PARKWAY AT THE INTERSECTIONS OF BOSCH AVENUE AND IMPERIAL DRIVE

City Engineer Brad Taylor gave a presentation outlining traffic control options for River Islands Parkway at the intersections of Bosch Avenue and Imperial Drive. A question and answer period followed the presentation. Vice Mayor Torres-O'Callaghan expressed concerns with removing the sidewalk and stop sign, noting that residents would likely continue to cross the intersection regardless; expressed support for installing a pedestrian hybrid beacon or a traffic signal. Councilmember Diallo noted that the intersection is heavily trafficked and expressed support for the recommended option to remove the stop sign and crosswalk, thereby directing pedestrians to use the adjacent traffic signals. Public speaker Padma Mariam expressed concern with the unusually high number of stop signs and traffic signals along River Islands Parkway, noting that it is confusing and results in constant stopand-qo traffic.

On a motion by Councilmember Diallo, seconded by Councilmembers Lazard, the City Council considered traffic control options for River Islands Parkway at the intersections of Bosch Avenue and Imperial Drive, and provided staff with direction to move forward with Option 1, with additional public outreach within the River Islands Development community, by the following roll call vote:

City Engineer Brad Taylor gave a presentation regarding traffic safety options on Spartan Way. A question and answer period followed.

# 6. COUNCIL COMMUNICATIONS

6.1 COUNCILMEMBER DIALLO REFERRAL - Discuss and Request Creating a 2x2 Committee between the City of Lathrop and San Joaquin County Sheriff's Office for Matters Related to a Proposed Memorandum of Understanding Regarding Jurisdictional Waterways in Lathrop

At the request of Councilmember Diallo, this referral was continued to the next meeting to allow the attorneys to continue their discussions.

6.2 COUNCILMEMBER DRESSER REFERRAL – Discuss and Request Project for Street Pavement Repairs on 7<sup>th</sup> Street in Front of the Post Office

Councilmember Dresser provided an overview of his referral, including concerns about limited parking spaces. A question and answer period followed. City Attorney Salvador Navarrete provided information regarding public right-of-way access on federal property, and City Manager Stephen Salvatore added details about surveying the area and returning to the Council with potential options for consideration. By consensus, the City Council directed staff to explore pavement repair options for 7th Street in front of the Post Office.

6.3 COUNCILMEMBER DRESSER REFERRAL – Discuss and Request Red Light Violation Cameras at Multiple Intersections

Councilmember Dresser provided an overview of his referral, expressing concerns about red light violators and requesting that staff research the cost of installing red light violation cameras at multiple intersections. City Manager Stephen Salvatore noted recently proposed legislation that would reduce penalties for red light violations. By consensus, the City Council directed staff to investigate the installation costs associated with red light violation cameras at multiple intersections.

6.4 MAYOR & COUNCILMEMBER COMMITTEE REPORT(S)

Vice Mayor Torres-O'Callagan, Councilmember Diallo, and Mayor Akinjo reported their attendance at the recent Annual League of California Cities Conference.

During the conference, Councilmember Diallo was appointed President of the Central Valley Division and  $1^{\rm st}$  Vice President of the African American Caucus, and Vice Mayor Torres-O'Callaghan was appointed as  $2^{\rm nd}$  Vice President of the Central Valley Division.

6.5 MAYOR & COUNCILMEMBER COMMENT(S)

Councilmember Diallo expressed appreciation to City Engineer Brad Taylor for his collaboration with Caltrans on traffic signal timing adjustments. Vice Mayor Torres-O'Callaghan thanked Public Works staff for their storm preparations in anticipation of the heavy winds and rain. Councilmember Dresser reported his attendance to the Lathrop-Manteca Fire Department open house event, and the Cheema Trucking grand opening. Mayor Akinjo echoed similar sentiments.

Prior to adjournment, Chief Sealy provided an update on a current traffic incident that resulted in the closure of McKinley between Louise Avenue and Yosemite Avenue
