The <u>City of Lathrop</u> remains on track to stand up its first-ever <u>Police Department</u> this July, and more significant milestones have been reached over the past month.

First, as shared in last month's update, two candidates for Commanders received job offers, and now that their pre-employment physical and background checks are complete, they have begun working for the Department.

Commander Kyle Oki, previously of the San Jose Police Department, comes to Lathrop with 29-year of service in law enforcement. Cmdr. Oki has experience working on assignments including Patrol, Field Training Officer, Special Operations in the Street Crimes and Metro Units, Vice, the Division of Gaming Control, Supervisor of the Assaults Unit, Human Trafficking Task Force, Internal Affairs and the Homicide Crime Scene Unit. Cmdr. Oki has also been recognized for his efforts to combat Human Trafficking, focusing on victim-based approaches to protect the most vulnerable members of the community.

Commander Stephen Sealy comes to Lathrop by way of a 16-year career with the Foster City Police Department. Cmdr. Sealy was highly regarded within the Foster City PD for his leadership skills and community-oriented policing. His previous duties included working in Patrol, S.W.A.T., as a Detective, a member of the Gang Task Force, Field Training, and the Honor Guard. Cmdr. Sealy also served in the US Army for over 12 years and recently received his master's degree in Public Safety and Management.

Similarly appearing images will also help identify our service vehicles and other hardware.

Lastly, we are proud to share that the Lathrop Police Department Badges have been designed and will be unveiled at a ceremony this Spring. The Police Badge is the most recognizable icon of law enforcement officers. It is not just a tool to identify the officer and from which department they come; it represents the willingness to sacrifice one's safety to assist others and is a symbol and a promise to uphold the best interests of their community within their position. The sworn personnel who will display our badge on their uniforms will know that wearing them comes with a duty to always serve respectfully and honorably.
