LATHROP PREPARED TO SERVE & PROTECT - CATS, DOGS & ANIMALS. "The mission of Lathrop Animal Services is to protect the welfare of all animals in Lathrop

while promoting the health and safety of animals and residents within our community." The Lathrop Animal Services, a division under the Lathrop Police Department, addresses stray animals,

unwanted pets, the humane treatment and care of animals, and the disposal of dead animals The City of Manteca provided contracted animal shelter services to the City of Lathrop since

1993. However, due to lack of space and overcrowding Manteca expressed their desire to terminate the contract as of September 30, 2022. A new agreement between the Delta Humane Society and SPCA of San Joaquin County (Stockton) and the City of Lathrop was executed On

The Delta Humane Society & SPCA serves the Stockton-San Joaquin region as a "No Kill" animal shelter. The Lathrop Police Department has been allocated 36 kennels for its direct use. Currently, all 36 kennels are at capacity with stray and adoptable animals, a case that always happens in many animal shelters around the world.

Due to the demand for space and need of an animal shelter, the Lathrop City Council approved the construction of a new temporary home for the Lathrop Police Department Animal Services Division and an animal shelter

The City of Lathrop has initiated the construction of a Temporary Animal Shelter to ensure that efficient public service is provided.

What Can I do when I find an Animal?

- If you find a Stray Animal, please be sure to do the following:
- Contact Lathrop Police Department to report the animal found at 209-647-6400 . Go door-to-door. The chances are someone knows who the owner is.

- Go to any Veterinarian and have the animal scanned for a microchip.









