# DROUGHT TOLERANT LANDSCAPING GRANT PROGRAM

Looking to create an attractive, low maintenance front-yard landscaping that will thrive in California's dry summer climate and during a drought? The City of Lathrop has a new grant program to help residents with financial assistance to convert landscaping to drought tolerant materials. All residents with an active water account in good standing are eligible for \$0.50 per square foot of improved drought tolerant landscaping up to a max grant rebate award of \$500. Income qualified residents may be eligible for an increased rebate of \$1.00 per square foot of improved landscaping up to a maximum of \$1,000. - Check certifications Make sure the company has the required licenses, registration, certificates, and insurance. Verify the status of a pest control company's license at https://www.pestboard.ca.gov/license.shtml
- · Ask about Integrated Pest Management (IPM) IPM is an eco-friendly and effective method of pest control. Before hiring, check if your pest control or landscaping professional practices IPM. Three programs that certify and list pest control companies that provide IPM services are EcoWise, GreenPro, and Green Shield.

Don't have the time or Any leftover pesticides must be taken to a household hazardous waste facility. You may only dispose of empty. pest unrinsed pesticide containers in the trash. Household Hazardous items can be dropped off at the San Joaquin County Household Hazardous Waste Consolidation Facility

#### Go Green with **Green Waste**

Whether you maintain your own yard or choose to hire a landscaper, it's important to know how to properly dispose of yard waste to prevent plant material (e.g., leaves, branches, and trimmings) from clogging local storm drain systems.

Wondering what to do with your leaves and other yard waste this fall?

Annual Leaf and Limb Pickup

- During the first 2 weeks of January, leaves and limbs that do not fit into your organics cart will be collected on the curb.
- · Leaves must be bagged and cannot exceed more than 50 lbs.
- Bundle brush with string or twine. Do not use wire.
- · Limbs must not exceed 4 feet in length and 4 inches in diameter


