#### **Keeping Your Animals Safe**

The warm weather has approached the central valley, and keeping your animals safe during the summer is essential. Here are some helpful tips:

- Pets can get dehydrated quickly, so give them plenty of fresh, clean water when it's hot or humid outdoors. Make sure your pets have a shady place to get out of the sun, be careful not to over-exercise them, and keep them indoors when it's extremely hot.
- Know the symptoms of overheating in pets, which include excessive panting or difficulty breathing, increased heart and respiratory rate, drooling, mild weakness, stupor, or even collapse. Symptoms can also include seizures, bloody diarrhea, vomiting, and an elevated body temperature of over 104 degrees.
- Animals with flat faces, like Pugs and Persian cats, are more susceptible to heat stroke since they cannot pant as effectively. These pets, along with the elderly, the overweight, and those with heart or lung diseases, should be kept cool in air-conditioned rooms as much as possible.
- Never leave your animals alone in a parked vehicle. Not only can it lead to fatal heat stroke, but it is also illegal in several states!
- Do not leave pets unsupervised around a pool—not all dogs are good swimmers. Introduce your pets to water gradually, and make sure they wear flotation devices when on boats. Rinse your dog off after swimming to remove chlorine or salt from its fur, and keep your dog from drinking pool water containing chlorine and other chemicals.
- Open unscreened windows pose a real danger to pets, who often fall out of them. Keep all unscreened windows or doors in your home closed, and ensure adjustable screens are tightly secured.

### Program Helps Lathrop Residents with Home Repairs

The Lathrop Property Rehabilitation Program, managed and administered by the San Joaquin County Neighborhood Preservation Division, has received nine (9) applications from Lathrop residents of which one (1) project has been completed and four (4) are pending completion. Timing for the process varies by each project based on the need. Due to the rainstorms experienced this winter, many of the requests have been for roof repairs and are being processed separately.

#### Property Rehabilitation Program

This program offers assistance to low-income\* homeowners with needed home repairs through a low interest loan.

Eligible repairs may include:

- · Roof Replacement
- Electrical
- · Kitchen & Bathroom Repairs
- Handicap Accessibility
- Painting
- · Linoleum & Carpeting Replacement
- Plumbing Corrections
- Window Replacement

#### DON'T RUN OFF! TIPS TO KEEP WATER IN YOUR YARD

Harmful runoff can occur when water (either rain or irrigation) comes into contact with and washes pesticides, soil, or other products used around your home into storm drains and waterways. You can help reduce harmful runoff and protect local waterbodies by using less-toxic products and slowing the flow of pollutants from your yard and garden.

#### **Integrated Pest Management (IPM)**



A simple way to help keep pesticides out of the local waterbodies is to reduce the amount of chemicals you apply to your yard and garden. To do this, while managing

pest problems effectively, you can use Integrated Pest Management (IPM), which focuses on low- to no-pesticide methods of pest control, such as:

- Alternatives Use alternatives to pesticides for pest control, such as traps, physical removal, natural deterrents, and/or natural predators.



#### **Water-Conscious Landscaping**

If pesticides must be used, be sure to follow these landscaping tips to help keep water and chemicals in your yard and out of our creeks and rivers.



- Avoid Overwatering Overwatering and overspray will lead to increased runoff which can carry along the pesticides you apply. - Porous Surfaces Use gravel, stones, or pavers to allow water to soak into the soil in areas where you don't have plants. Consider adding mulch to your garden to keep your soil moist, reduce evaporation, and restrict weed growth.
