NOTICE TO CONTRACTORS

The City of Lathrop invites sealed informal bids for the provision of services for **FY 2023-2024 STREET SWEEPING SERVICES**. Sealed bids will be received at the City of Lathrop, located at 390 Towne Centre Drive, Lathrop, CA until **6:00 PM on Tuesday, August 22, 2023**. Bids submitted by mail shall be addressed to: City of Lathrop, Attention Senior Construction Manager / SEALED BID FOR SWEEPING, 390 Towne Centre Drive, Lathrop, CA 95330.

SCOPE OF WORK

The work to be performed under this contract is generally described as, but not necessarily limited to the provision of scheduled PM₁₀-efficient mobile sweeping services of approximately 172 curb miles of specified City-owned streets and roadside and median street gutters and approximately 292,000 square feet of parking lots, and the provision of unscheduled and/or emergency sweeping services for any City-owned facility, as further specified in the Bid Specifications.

BIDDING INFORMATION

In accordance with SB 854, all contractors who bid or work on Public Works projects for the City of Lathrop are subject to the following requirements:

- **DIR Registration.** Each Bidder submitting a proposal to complete the work, labor, materials and/or services (“Work”) subject to this procurement must be a Department of Industrial Relations registered contractor pursuant to Labor Code Section 1725.5 (“DIR Registered Contractor”). A Bidder who is not a DIR Registered Contractor when submitting a proposal for Work is deemed “not qualified” and the proposal of such a Bidder will be rejected as non-responsive. Pursuant to Labor Code Section 1725.5, all Subcontractors identified in a Bidder’s Subcontractors’ List shall be DIR Registered Contractors. If awarded the Contract for the Work, at all times during performance of the Work, the Bidder and all Subcontractors, of any tier, shall be DIR Registered Contractors.

INSTRUCTIONS TO BIDDERS**BACKGROUND**

The City of Lathrop is located in the San Joaquin Valley, 70 miles east of San Francisco, CA and has an approximate population of 35,000 people. This solicited service will help to maintain the City's streets in a clean and safe condition, and contribute to the City's compliance with its National Pollution Discharge Elimination System (NPDES) permit.

DESCRIPTION OF WORK

The work (hereinafter "Work") as more specifically defined in Attachment A of the Contract Specifications to be performed under this contract shall consist of providing for the satisfactory performance of the street sweeping services for the streets and parking lots identified in Sections 1a and 1b of the Work Scope and Attachments B-F of these Bid Documents. The approximately 175 total curb miles and 290,000 square feet of parking lots are estimated from the City's pavement management system, GIS and other sources. Bidder is responsible for examining the locations of work to verify all information related to the street and parking lot locations and dimensions as part of their "due diligence".

Contractor shall furnish all tools, equipment, supplies and manufactured articles, furnish all transportation, utilities, facilities and services, including fuel, power and essential communications, and perform all labor, supervision, and or other operations required to fulfill the Contract in strict accordance with the Contract Documents. In the event of a mechanical breakdown, service will be provided with sufficient backup equipment to ensure schedule adherence. Contractor shall have at least two sweepers available for immediate use on a 24-hour basis.

See **Street Sweeping Road List, Attachment B** for the list of roads to be swept.

See **Street Sweeping Maps, Attachment C** for a City map highlighting areas to be swept.

INSTRUCTIONS TO BIDDERS

BID

Before submitting a Bid, bidders shall carefully examine and read the Bid Documents, visit the site of the work, and fully inform themselves as to all existing site conditions and limitations.

Bidders are required to fully inform themselves of the conditions relating to performance of the Work, and must employ, as far as possible, such methods and means in carrying out the Work as will not cause any interruption or interference to any other contractor or operations of the City or any other public agency.

Submission of a Bid shall be considered conclusive evidence that the Bidder has fully studied the Bid Documents, that Contractor has examined the site of the work, and that the Bidder is satisfied as to the conditions to be encountered in performing the work and as to the requirements of the Bid Documents.

Bids shall be properly executed upon the Bid form bound herein and made a part of these Bid Documents. All blank spaces in the Bid forms must be filled in, in black or blue ink. Numbers shall be stated both in words and in figures where indicated on the Bid form, and original, 'wet' signatures are required of all persons signing the Bid form. No changes on the Bid forms are allowed. In case of a difference in written words and figures, the amount stated in written words shall govern unless obviously in error.

SUBMISSION OF BIDS

All Bids must be submitted at the place and before the time prescribed in the Notice to Contractors. It is the Bidders' sole responsibility to see that his Bid is received in proper time. Bids received after that time will not be accepted. Bids will be opened publicly and read aloud immediately after the time for receipt has expired; all interested parties are invited to attend.

INSTRUCTIONS TO BIDDERS

INTERPRETATION OF SCOPE OF WORK / WORK SPECIFICATIONS

If any person contemplating submitting a Bid is in doubt as to the true meaning of any part of the Bid Documents, or finds discrepancies in or omissions from the Bid Documents, he/she may submit to the City's Project Manager (as listed in Section 00002 Project Directory of these Specifications) a written request for an interpretation or correction thereof. All written requests must be received a minimum of 72 hours prior to bid opening; requests received after this time will not be accepted. The person submitting the request will be responsible for its prompt delivery. Any interpretation or correction of the Bid Specifications will be made only by Addendum duly issued and a copy of such Addendum will be mailed or delivered to each person receiving a set of the Bid Documents. The City will not be responsible for any other explanations or interpretations of the Bid Documents. In the interest of providing information to plan holders quickly, Contractors are encouraged to provide email address(es) to the City.

ADDENDA

Any Addenda issued before the time of bid opening are deemed to be made a part of the Bid Documents.

MODIFICATION AND WITHDRAWAL OF BIDS

No modification of bids will be allowed. Any bidder may withdraw its bid, either personally or by telegraphic or written request, if such request is received by the Project Manager prior to the scheduled time for bid opening. Any bid so withdrawn may not be resubmitted.

Bids delivered to the Project Manager at the time set for opening shall be irrevocable, and no bidder may withdraw its bid for a period of 60 days after the date of the opening of bids.

BIDDERS INTERESTED IN MORE THAN ONE BID

No Bidder, whether a person, firm, partnership, corporation, or association, shall be allowed to make, file, or to be interested in more than one Bid for the same work unless alternate bids are called for. A person, firm, partnership, corporation, or association who has submitted a sub bid to a Bidder, or who has quoted prices on materials to a Bidder, is not thereby disqualified from submitting a sub bid or quoting prices to other Bidders.

DISQUALIFICATION OF BIDDERS

More than one Bid for the same work from a person, firm, partnership, corporation, or association under the same or different name will not be accepted. Reasonable ground for believing that any person, firm, partnership, corporation, or association is interested in more than one Bid for the same work will cause the rejection of all Bids for the work in which such Bidder is interested. Any or all Bids will be rejected if there is reason for believing that collusion exists among any of the Bidders.

FILING OF BID PROTESTS

Bidders may file a "protest" of the recommended award of a contract solicited by the Notice Inviting Bids with the City. In order to be considered valid, a bidder's protest submittal must:

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- Be filed within three (3) business days of bid opening date, in writing with the City Engineer.
- Clearly identify the specific accusation involved.
- Clearly identify the specific City Staff recommendation, issue and/or decision being protested.
- Specify, in detail, the grounds of the protest and the facts supporting the protest.
- Include all relevant, supporting documentation with the protest at time of filing.

If the protest does not comply with each and every one all of these requirements, it will be rejected as invalid and incomplete.

Upon submittal of a complete protest submittal, if the protest is valid, the City will review the basis of the protest and all relevant information. The City will deny or fully or partially concur with the protest and provide a written decision to the protestor. The protestor may then appeal the decision of the City Engineer to the City Council.

EXPERIENCE OF BIDDERS

Each Bid shall be supported by a statement of the Bidders' experience on the form entitled "INFORMATION REQUIRED OF BIDDER," bound herein.

BIDDER'S STATEMENT OF SUBCONTRACTORS

In the form entitled List of Subcontractors, in the Information Required of Bidder and pursuant to Section 4107 of the Public Contract Code, the Bidder shall submit the name and location of the place of business of each subcontractor who will perform work or labor or render service to the Bidder in or about the performance of the Work or improvement, or a subcontractor licensed by the State of California who under subcontract to the Bidder specially performs a portion of the work, in an amount in excess of one-half of one percent (1/2%) of the Bid. The Bidder shall indicate the portion which will be done by each such subcontractor for each such portion as is defined by the subcontractor in its bid. This listing requirement shall apply to sub-subcontractors of any subcontractor which is utilized to perform the Work, which sub-subcontractors perform work in excess of one-half of one percent of the Contractor's Total Bid Price. The Contractor shall ensure by Contract that any subcontractor installing the Work fulfills the responsibilities of a prime contractor under Public Contract Code Section 4100, et. seq.

Failure to so list subcontractors is an express statement by the Bidder that it will perform that portion of the work with its own forces. The Bidder may not substitute any person or subcontractor for a listed subcontractor without first obtaining written permission of the Project Manager pursuant to provisions of Section 4107 of the Public Contract Code.

CALIFORNIA WAGE RATE REQUIREMENTS

In accordance with the provisions of California Labor Code Sections 1770, 1773, 1773.1, 1773.6 and 1773.7 as amended, the Director of the Department of Industrial Relations has determined the

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general prevailing rate of per diem wages in accordance with the standards set forth in Section 1773 for the locality in which the Work is to be performed. A copy of said wage rates is on file at the office of the City of Lathrop and shall be made available to any interested party on request. It shall be mandatory upon the Contractor to whom the Work is awarded and upon any subcontractor under the Contractor to pay not less than said specified rates to all workers employed by them in the execution of the Work.

DEPARTMENT OF INDUSTRIAL RELATIONS- COMPLIANCE MONITORING UNIT

DIR Registration.

Contractor and Subcontractor Compliance. Strict compliance with DIR registration requirements pursuant to Labor Code Section 1725.5 is a material obligation of the Contractor under the Contract Documents. The foregoing includes without limitation, compliance with DIR Registration requirements at all times during performance of the Work by the Contractor and all Subcontractors of any tier. The failure of the Contractor and all Subcontractors, of every tier, to be DIR registered at all times during the performance of the Work is the Contractor's default of a material obligation of the Contractor under the Contract Documents.

No Subcontractor Performance of Work without DIR Registration. No portion of the Work is permitted to be performed by a Subcontractor of any tier unless the Subcontractor is a DIR Registered contractor.

Contractor Obligation to Verify Subcontractor DIR Registration Status. An affirmative and on-going obligation of the Contractor under the Contract Documents is the Contractor's verification that all Subcontractors, of all tiers, are at all times during performance of Work in full and strict compliance with DIR Registration requirements. The Contractor shall not permit or allow any Subcontractor of any tier to perform any Work without the Contractor's verification that all such Subcontractors are in full and strict compliance with DIR Registration requirements.

Contractor Obligation to Request Substitution of Non-DIR Registered Subcontractor. If any Subcontractor identified in the Contractor's Subcontractor List submitted with the Contractor's proposal for the Work is not DIR Registered at the time of opening of proposals for the Work or if a Subcontractor's DIR registration lapses prior to or during a Subcontractor's performance of Work, the Contractor shall request the CITY's consent to substitute the non-DIR registered Subcontractor pursuant to Labor Code Section 1771.1(c)(3) and/ or Labor Code Section 1771.1(d).

Certified Payroll Records.

Compliance with Labor Code Section 1771.4 and 1776. A material obligation of the Contractor under the Contract Documents is: (i) the Contractor's strict compliance with the requirements pursuant to Labor Code Section 1771.4 and 1776 for preparation and submittal of Certified Payroll Records ("CPR"); and (ii) the Contractor's enforcement of CPR preparation and submittal for all Subcontractors of every tier.

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Express Condition Precedent to Payment of Contract Price. Strict compliance with CPR requirements established pursuant to Labor Code Section 1776 is an express condition precedent to the CITY's obligation to: (i) process any request for payment of any portion of the Contract Price; or (ii) to disburse any portion of the Contract Price to the Contractor. The Contractor shall demonstrate strict compliance with CPR preparation and submittal requirements by delivery to the CITY of electronic files or hard copies of all CPR's submitted by the Contractor and/ or Subcontractors for Work pursuant to Labor Code Section 1771.4 and 1776 concurrently with the submittal thereof to the Labor Commissioner. The CITY: (i) shall not be obligated to process or disburse any portion of the Contract Price; or (ii) shall not be deemed in default of the CITY's obligations under the Contract Documents unless the Contractor's demonstrates strict compliance with CPR preparation and submittal requirements.

Prevailing Wage Rate (PWR) Monitoring and Enforcement. During the Work, pursuant to Labor Code Section 1771.4(a)(4), the Department of Industrial Relations shall monitor and enforce the obligation of the Construction and Subcontractors of every tier to pay the laborers performing any portion of the work the PWR established for the classification of work/ labor performed.

AWARD OF CONTRACT

Award of the Contract will be made only to a Responsible Bidder submitting a responsive bid and possessing the ability to perform successfully, which will be determined by considering such matters as Contractor's integrity, compliance with public policy, record of past performance, and financial and technical resources.

Award of the contract shall be made to responsible bidder whose responsive bid, conforming with all the material terms and conditions of the invitation for bids, is the lowest total base bid shown in the bid schedule. Any challenge or contest of competing bids by Bidders must be submitted to the Project Manager in writing within 3 days from the date of bid opening.

The City of Lathrop hereby notifies all bidders that it will affirmatively ensure that in any contract entered into pursuant to this advertisement, disadvantaged businesses including minority and woman owned business enterprises will be afforded full opportunity to submit bids in response to this invitation and will not be discriminated against on the grounds of race, color, or national origin in consideration for an award.

Pursuant to Public Contract Code Section 1103, "Responsible Bidder" means a bidder who has demonstrated the attribute of trustworthiness, as well as quality, fitness, capacity, and experience to satisfactorily perform the public works contract.

BID BOND, INSURANCE AND WORKERS' COMPENSATION

Each Bid shall be accompanied by a certified or cashier's check or an approved Bid Bond in the amount of ten percent (10%) of the Total Bid Price payable to the City of Lathrop. Said check or bond shall be made payable to the City and shall be given as a guarantee that the Bidder, if awarded the Work, will enter into a Contract with the City, and will furnish the necessary insurance and worker's compensation certificates. In case of refusal or failure to enter into said Contract, the check or Bid Bond, as the case may be, shall be forfeited to the City. If the Bidder elects to furnish

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a Bid Bond as its Bid security, the Bidder shall use the Bid Bond form bound herein, or one conforming substantially to it in form.

TERM OF CONTRACT

The initial term of this Contract is anticipated to be from September 11, 2023 through June 30, 2024. The City may renew the contract through written notification to the contractor annually at its discretion, commencing on July 1, 2024, for up to three (3) additional one-year terms, not to exceed June 30, 2027. Written notification of the City's desire to renew the contract shall be provided to the Contractor a minimum of 30 days prior to the expiration date of the contract. Annual price adjustment, if any, shall be as described in Section 800, *Special Conditions* of these Contract Specifications.

LATHROP CITY RIGHTS RESERVED

The City of Lathrop reserves the right to accept or reject any or all Bids, to waive any irregularity in a Bid, and to make award to the lowest responsive, responsible Bidder as it may best serve the interest of the City of Lathrop.

BUSINESS LICENSE

Once the proposal has been awarded, the Contractor shall obtain and maintain a City of Lathrop Business License for the period covered by the Agreement. Any subcontractor(s) employed by the Contractor shall also obtain and maintain a City of Lathrop Business License for the duration of their services to the Contractor.

EXECUTION OF CONTRACT

The form of Contract, which the successful Bidder as Contractor will be required to execute, is included in the Contract Documents of these Specifications, and should be carefully examined by the Bidder. The Contract will be executed in two original counterparts.

The successful Bidder shall execute and return all original Contract Documents to the Project Manager within 10 calendar days after receipt of the Notice of Award.

The successful Bidder shall also secure and furnish certificates of insurance and endorsements indicating proof of coverage with execution of the Contract.

The successful Contractor and any of his/her subcontractors shall submit a copy of his/her receipt or other evidence showing payment of a current City of Lathrop Business License and any other license, if applicable.

2. Beginning of Work and Time of Completion.

The Contractor shall begin work within **ten (10)** calendar days after receipt of the Notice to Proceed. This Contract is an on-going Contract with regularly scheduled tasks.

3. Contract Change Orders.

Change Orders must be approved by the City Manager or City Council.

4. Insurance Requirements.

A. Category 2 “Intermediate Risk”

Insurance Requirements

i. Commercial General Liability

a. Contractor shall maintain commercial general liability insurance with coverage at least as broad as Insurance Services Office form CG 00 01, in an amount not less than two million dollars (\$2,000,000) per occurrence for bodily injury, personal injury, and property damage, including without limitation, blanket contractual liability. If a general aggregate limit applies, either the general aggregate limit shall apply separately to this project/location or the general aggregate limit shall be twice the required occurrence limit. Contractor’s general liability policies shall be primary and shall not seek contribution from the City’s coverage, and be endorsed using Insurance Services Office form CG 20 10 (or equivalent) to provide that City and its officers, officials, employees, and agents shall be additional insureds under such policies. For construction projects, an endorsement providing completed operations coverage for the additional insured, ISO form CG 20 37 (or equivalent), is also required.

b. Any failure to comply with reporting provisions of the policies by Contractor shall not affect coverage provided the City.

c. Coverage shall state that Contractor insurance shall apply separately to each insured against whom claim is made or suit is brought, except with respect to the limits of the insurer’s liability.

d. Coverage shall contain a waiver of subrogation in favor of the City.

iv. All Coverages

Each insurance policy required by the agreement shall be endorsed to state that coverage shall not be suspended, voided, cancelled, or reduced in limits except after thirty (30) days' prior written notice has been given to the City, except that ten (10) days' prior written notice shall apply in the event of cancellation for nonpayment of premium.

b. All self-insurance, self-insured retentions, and deductibles must be declared and approved by the City.

c. Evidence of Insurance - Prior to commencement of work, the Contractor shall furnish the City with certificates, additional insured endorsements, and waivers of subrogation evidencing compliance with the insurance requirements above. The Contractor must agree to provide complete, certified copies of all required insurance policies if requested by the City.

d. Acceptability of Insurers - Insurance shall be placed with insurers admitted in the State of California and with an AM Best rating of A- VII or higher.

e. Subcontractors and Consultants - A category of risk and the applicable insurance requirements will be determined on a "per subcontractor" or "per consultant" basis, considering the particular work to be done by the subcontractor or consultant and the interrelationship of that work to other work being conducted by the Contractor.

5. Quality of Services.

The quality of the services to be performed by the Contractor will be in accord with the specifications, and where not specified, in accord with generally accepted, high professional standards. The Contractor will have an adequate, trained workforce and will perform services with diligence and competence.

6. Equipment.

Equipment used in this Contract shall be adequate and appropriate for the work and in good condition to allow timely performance of tasks.

7. Compliance with Occupational Safety and Health Act of 1970.

8. Safety Training.

9. Audits by the City.

10. Performance Deficiencies.

If the Contractor fails to perform in accordance with the standards required in these specifications, the following steps will be taken:

- A. Informal, verbal, documented notification of Contractor by the Streets Maintenance Services Supervisor.
- B. If the Contractor continues not to perform in accordance with the specification requirements, Contractor shall be served a written warning describing the performance problem(s) and within five (5) working days from the date of the warning, Contractor shall meet with the Streets Maintenance Services Supervisor of the City and provide a written plan of action to address performance issues, to be approved or amended by the Streets Maintenance Services Supervisor as a result of the meeting.
- C. If the performance of the Contractor continues not to meet specification requirements, the City will initiate termination of the contract in accordance with Section 12, Termination of Contract for Cause, of the General Conditions.

11. Failure to Perform

Failure to complete Street Sweeping Services in accordance with the required frequency of work, or to the standards required in these specifications, will result in a reduction of the monthly payment based on the following percentage factor: annual cost of the maintenance

item as percent of the Total Annual Cost for the Street Sweeping Services. The minimum withholding shall be \$300 for each occurrence of non-compliance.

As an alternative, the City of Lathrop shall have the right to perform or have performed such maintenance. The City of Lathrop will then deduct 100% of all costs, including administrative fees, or \$300 from the money due the Contractor, whichever is greater. Continued failure by the Contractor to perform to the standards and time schedules in these specifications shall be cause to terminate this Contract.

12. Termination of Contract for Cause

The City may terminate this Contract if the Contractor materially breaches any of its obligations under this Contract (including repeated failure to complete services to the quality and schedule required in the specifications), and fails to submit an action plan how to cure such breach within fifteen (15) days after written notice by the City specifically describing the breach.

13. Termination of Contract due to Acts beyond the Control of the City of Lathrop

This contract may be terminated by the City of Lathrop, without liability for damages, whenever the City of Lathrop is prevented by operations of the law, an act of God, or by the official action of the public, federal or state authorities from complying with the provisions of this contract.

14. Contract Reduction due to Funding Reductions

This contract may be reduced in scope and quantity by the City of Lathrop without liability for damages, in the event funding reductions are enacted by law, by actions of the public, or by federal or state authorities. At such time that a reduction occurs, the scope of work in the areas under contract will be revised and reduced commensurate with the funding. Adjustment of the contract specifications and corresponding contract prices will be negotiated in accordance with available funding.

15. Precedence of Documents.

The order of precedence of documents shall be: (1) Supplemental Agreements, or Change Orders, the latest having precedence over another dated earlier; (2) Special Conditions; (3) General Conditions; (4) Scope of Work.

Termination of Contract (by Contractor). Contractor must provide at least 60 days written notice to the City prior to termination of the contract.

Price Adjustment. Contract prices shall remain fixed through June 30, 2024. Any request by the Contractor for contract price adjustment thereafter shall be substantiated by supportive documentation correlated to, and in no case greater than a 5% increase as defined below in the California Department of General Services California Construction Cost Index: <https://www.dgs.ca.gov/RES/RES/Resources/Page-Content/Real-Estate-Services-Division-Resources-List-Folder/DGS-California-Construction-Cost-Index-CCCI> It is expressly understood that contract rate increases are not automatic nor guaranteed. All price adjustment requests must be submitted in writing no later than March 31st of the current contract term to be included in the next budget year and will not go into effect until July 1st of that same year. If considered, price adjustments due to an increase in said index shall be calculated between the indices of February of the previous year to February of the current contract term.

Contract Administration. The Contract will be administered by the Director of Public Works of the City of Lathrop, acting either directly or through properly authorized agents.

Compensation. Compensation will be provided in two different ways under this Contract:

- 1) Regular, scheduled street sweeping shall be paid on a monthly basis in accordance with the Monthly and/or Quarterly Contract Unit Prices per the Bid Proposal Form, Schedule A.
- 2) Street sweeping performed on an as-needed basis shall be paid in accordance with the unit price per the Bid Proposal Form, Schedule B. Payment to Contractor will be made within 30 days of submittal of a complete invoice.

Additional Street Sweeping Services. The City reserves the right to add Sweeping Services, not currently included in this Request for Proposal, either as an Add-Option to this contract by change-order, or enter into a new contract, at the City's discretion. The compensation for additional Street or Parking Lot Sweeping Services will be determined using the corresponding curb-mile unit price submitted by the Contractor on the Bid Proposal Form, Schedule A.

WORK SCOPE AND SPECIFICATIONS

Contractor shall use and furnish at Contractor's expense all labor, equipment, and materials necessary for the satisfactory performance of the street sweeping and parking lot sweeping work set forth herein. After sweeping, curbs, gutters and streets shall be left in a clean condition. The sweeping shall include as many passes as necessary to leave the entire street and all gutters in a clean condition; therefore, Contractor will be responsible for the sweeping and removal of any relevant significant debris at any location along a City street scheduled for sweeping.

1. Schedule

Prior to starting work, the Contractor shall submit to the City a proposed sweeping schedule (including dates and times) for residential and commercial streets, and parking lots. Contractor's proposed schedule shall not conflict with City of Lathrop Garbage Collection Schedule (Attachment C). Contractor's proposed schedule must be approved by the City prior to starting work. Any subsequent deviations from the approved schedule must be approved by the Director of Public Works or their designee prior to implementation of such deviations. If deviations from the schedule are approved, Contractor shall be responsible for notifying individual households that are affected IN WRITING at least 15 days (and no more than 30 days) prior to beginning the new schedule. All street sweeping shall be performed as follows:

a. City Street Segments with Curbs (per Bid Schedule A - Bid Item 1)

All City streets, including gutters, any medians, channelizing curbs and pedestrian islands therein shall be swept at the curb and the surface of pedestrian islands shall be swept with hand tools as necessary every month or as agreed between the City and the Contractor. Contractor shall sweep between curbs all surfaces of the street necessary to leave the entire street in clean condition following sweeping. Curb returns into streets without curb and gutter shall also be swept. Curb-miles of any sort of raised medians, pork chops and channelizing curbs have been accounted for in Attachment B – Street Sweeping Road List by adjusting the number of curbs within a segment or by listing standalone curb lengths. It is the Contractor's responsibility to verify all information contained in and related to these quantities as part of their "due diligence" and to notify the City of any noted discrepancies prior to submitting a bid.

Residential streets shall be swept between the hours of 7:00 a.m. and 5:00 p.m.

Non-residential streets shall be swept between the hours of 5:00 a.m. and 8:00 p.m.

b. Parking Lots (per Bid Schedule A - Bid Item 2)

The following City parking lots shall be swept on a quarterly basis:

Sweeping shall be performed on the perimeter of the parking lot as well as along all parking islands and planters bounded by curb, and entire interior of the parking lot. Sweeping shall be done between the hours of 12:00 a.m. to 5:30 a.m. Sweeping days and times for all parking lots shall be approved by the Director of Public Works or their designee.

c. Emergency Callouts

Contractor shall provide a 24-hour telephone number and/or list of employees, including telephone numbers and pager numbers, who are available for 24-hour emergency callout service. Compensation for emergency callouts shall be made according to the rate listed in the Bid Proposal Form – Unit Price for Emergency Callouts, Schedule B. Contractor shall have at least one sweeper available for immediate use on a 24-hour basis. An emergency is defined as an accident, storm event, fire, and other unforeseen events. Contractor shall make available at all times at least one sweeper for emergency events.

The Bid Item for this service “**UNIT PRICE FOR EMERGENCY CALL-OUT**” shall include one (1) sweeper and a driver.

Contractor must be on location at the site of the emergency within ONE (1) HOUR of the initial call from the City.

d. Holidays

If sweeping is not to be performed on certain holidays, Contractor must provide a schedule for sweeping the missed streets. City shall be advised in advance of holidays to be observed by Contractor and shall be provided with a makeup schedule that is no more than one week later.

e. Delays in Sweeping Schedule

In the event of wet weather, occurring on a scheduled sweeping day, Contractor shall not be required to sweep the scheduled day; however, Contractor will perform that month’s sweeping on the first dry day following the missed scheduled day. Contractor shall, if requested by the Director of Public Works or their designee, sweep any streets which become littered with storm debris. In the event of a

mechanical breakdown, service will be provided with sufficient backup equipment. Contractor shall have at least two sweepers available for immediate use on a 24-hour basis.

2. Estimated Miles to be Swept

A list of street segments with corresponding curb miles for which the City is soliciting sweeping services is provided in Attachment B. Estimated quantities are provided for informational and bidding purposes only. It is the Contractor’s responsibility to verify all information contained and related to these quantities as part of their “due diligence” and to notify the City of any noted discrepancies prior to submitting a bid.

It is recognized that a need may arise to increase or decrease the frequency of sweeping and thus increase or decrease the total number of curb miles swept or to increase callout hours. In the event that such a need does arise, Contractor shall adjust the frequency of sweeping as directed by the Director of Public Works or their designee. Should the City request changes in frequency of sweeping of streets and/or parking lots, the cost for adjusted respective sweeping services shall be based on the curb-mile costs submitted by the bidder in the Bid Proposal Forms – Base Bid for Scheduled Sweeping, Schedule A.

Any streets and/or parking lots added to the City during the term of the Agreement, by new construction, or annexation, shall be swept according to the appropriate schedule beginning when the Director of Public Works or their designee requests additional sweeping. The additional cost for sweeping these streets and/or parking lots shall be based on the curb-mile costs submitted by the bidder in the Bid Proposal Forms – Base Bid for Scheduled Sweeping, Schedule A.

The City additionally reserves the right to reduce or increase the number of curb miles or square feet to be swept within a given year without incurring an increase in the applicable agreed unit cost for that contract term.

3. Quality of Cleaning

The work performed by the Contractor will include sweeping all areas of the street, including a minimum eight-foot width as measured from the outside edge of the gutter broom in a single pass, as close as practicable to the face of curb for street edge curbs on both sides of the street. Streets with a curbed median will receive at least four passes with sweeping equipment to be considered swept. Noses or ends of curbed median areas and curb returns are to be maintained on the same frequency as the median or intersection with which they are associated.

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Cul-de-sacs, curb returns (radii) and curb bulb-outs/turn-pockets, pedestrian islands and gutters behind detached curb bulb-outs/turn-pockets of all streets will be swept along their entire length and free of debris on scheduled sweep days. Storm drain inlets are to remain free of debris and not collect sweeping debris during operations of the curb sweeping process.

The Contractor will remove all loose debris and material normally picked up and removable by a fully operational mechanical or vacuum street sweeper. This includes, but is not limited to: sand, gravel, glass, nails, bottles, cans, leaves, silt, mud, and litter.

All debris along the sweeping path, no matter what quantity, is to be removed from the public right-of-way and properly disposed of. Sweeping will normally consist of a single pass over an area, however, the Contractor will make additional passes, or such extra effort as may be required to reasonably clean the street.

The street sweeper must leave designated areas of sweeping free of dirt, litter, debris, obstructions, smears, and visible dust to the maximum extent practicable. If streets do not meet maximum extent practicable standards for sweeping on the scheduled sweeping day, the Contractor must sweep the deficient street within 48 hours after the normal sweeping day at no cost to the City. The determination of maximum extent practicable will be at the sole discretion of the Director of Public Works or their designee.

4. Sweeper Specifications

A. Air Quality: All sweepers utilized must be Certified PM10 Efficient. Sweeper capabilities will be no less than four cubic yards capacity and will be sufficient to perform the work required herein, and at an absolute minimum will include two primary sweepers and one back-up sweeper.

The primary sweepers will not be more than three years old, and the backup sweeper will not be more than five years old.

Attention is directed to the current California Air Resources Board, Environmental Protection Agency (EPA), San Joaquin Valley Air Pollution Control District, and Occupational Safety and Health Administration (OSHA) Standards. All equipment, tools, and materials that are furnished and/or installed as part of this Agreement must meet or exceed the aforementioned standards in order to be considered acceptable. The Contractor will need to have access to a broom-type sweeper in the event regenerative air sweepers are not capable of removing heavy debris.

B. Equipment: The Contractor's equipment will be subject to periodic inspection by the City. Copies of all equipment repair work will be sent to the Senior Construction Manager or their designee within 15 days of repair(s). Machines must be equipped with an adequate water spray-system for dust control.

The Contractor will supply all labor, equipment, supplies, and appurtenances to fulfill the requirements of this work. All equipment used for the performance of this Agreement will be heavy-duty mechanical broom sweeping and vacuum equipment necessary to properly clean streets.

Equipment will be properly maintained both as to condition and appearance so as to ensure a high level of street sweeping services and must meet all state regulations and requirements.

All sweepers must be capable of performing to the minimum criteria outlined herein and must be maintained both mechanically and visually throughout the term of this Agreement with capability to insure scheduled routine maintenance and proper adjustment for sweepers.

Sweepers must be capable of sweeping a minimum eight-foot width as measured from the outside edge of the gutter broom in a single pass. Street sweepers must have a minimum hopper capacity of four cubic yards. Sweepers must also be equipped with a left-gutter broom for median work. Alternative street sweepers may be considered at the sole discretion of the Director of Public Works or their designee.

Sweepers will be equipped with adequate warning devices and lights for safe operation and must meet all vehicle operation requirements of the California Department of Motor Vehicles and the California Highway Patrol.

All street sweepers must be equipped with a Global Positioning System (GPS) vehicle location device capable of tracking and reporting all street sweeper driving data to the Contractor such as path of travel, dates / times and vehicle speed and will be accessible for viewing by the Director of Public Works or their designee at all times.

The Contractor must keep a sufficient supply of spare parts, including brooms, to ensure continuous operation.

Brooms must be replaced periodically and adjusted to ensure maximum efficiency. No additional compensation will be made for periodic maintenance or for the replacement of parts to the equipment.

All equipment must be properly registered and insured in accordance with state and local laws. The Contractor will submit proof of ownership or a signed lease for the machinery proposed to be used to perform work under this Agreement.

C. Labeling: All units must be clearly and prominently marked with the Contractor's name, unit number and contact information.

D. Water: Water usage is required to assist with dust and storm water quality. The City will provide a City Hydrant Meter at no cost to the Contractor. A \$1,200 deposit is required,

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and will be returned to the contractor upon return of the meter in satisfactory condition. Contractor is responsible for staying up to date on State and local drought regulations and make adjustments to service as required.

5. **Sweeper Speed**

The sweeper must be operated at a safe speed, which will allow for maximum debris pick-up. Speeds should not exceed three to five miles per hour in heavy buildup of debris and six to eight miles per hour in light buildup. Contractor will not be compensated for streets swept while vehicle exceeds eight miles per hour.

6. **Street Sweeping Complaints**

The City has made available to the public written forms and a web application on which to log complaints. Complaints from the public will be forwarded to the Contractor, who shall investigate any complaints which may concern or involve the performance of this Contract. Contractor shall report to the Director of Public Works or their designee on the following working day as to the action or procedure taken with reference to any complaints. Complaints submitted by citizens will be saved in the City's complaint database.

7. **Disposal of Sweepings**

The Contractor shall be responsible for the costs associated with the disposal of street sweeper waste. Contractor shall dispose of all refuse collected by hauling same to and dumping into the City's designated street sweeping dumpster, located at 1199 Thomsen Road; access to the site is gained via Sixth Street entrance, as shown on Attachment F – *Sweeping Dumpster Location Map*.

Refuse shall not be stored on the street but shall be loaded into trucks or in appropriately placed containers, acceptable to the Director of Public Works. If containers are used, they shall be dumped upon completion of the day's sweeping cycle.

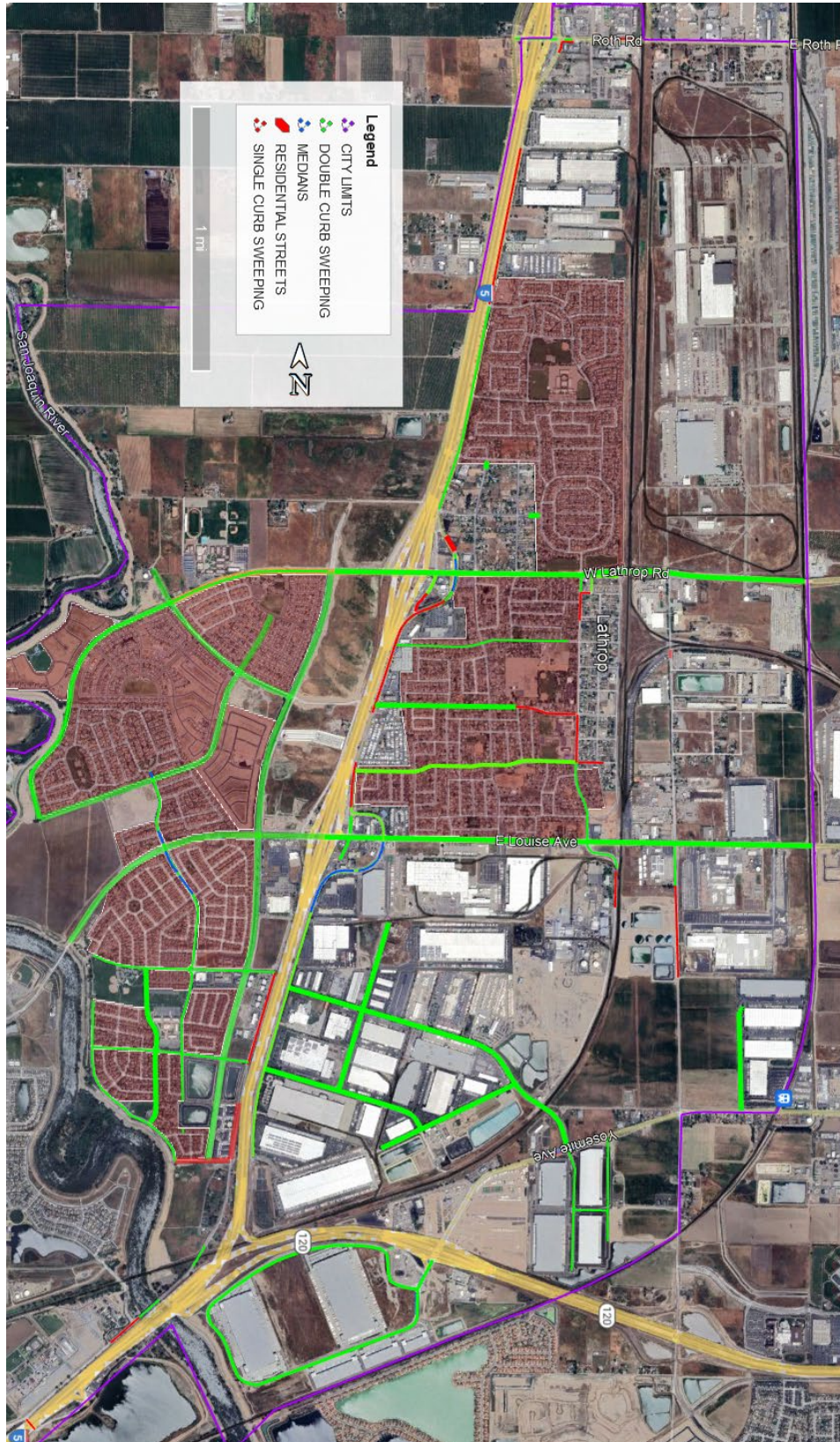

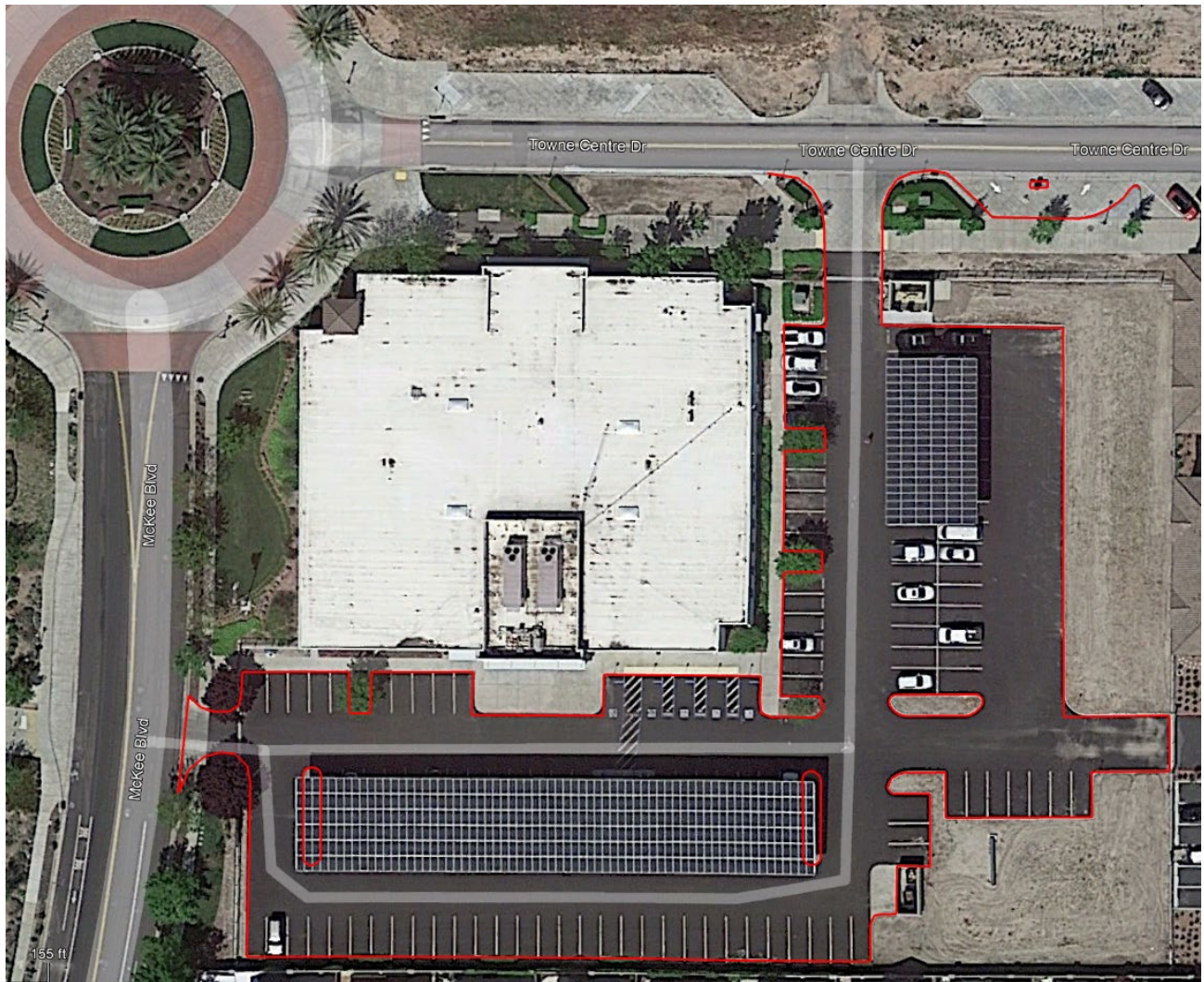

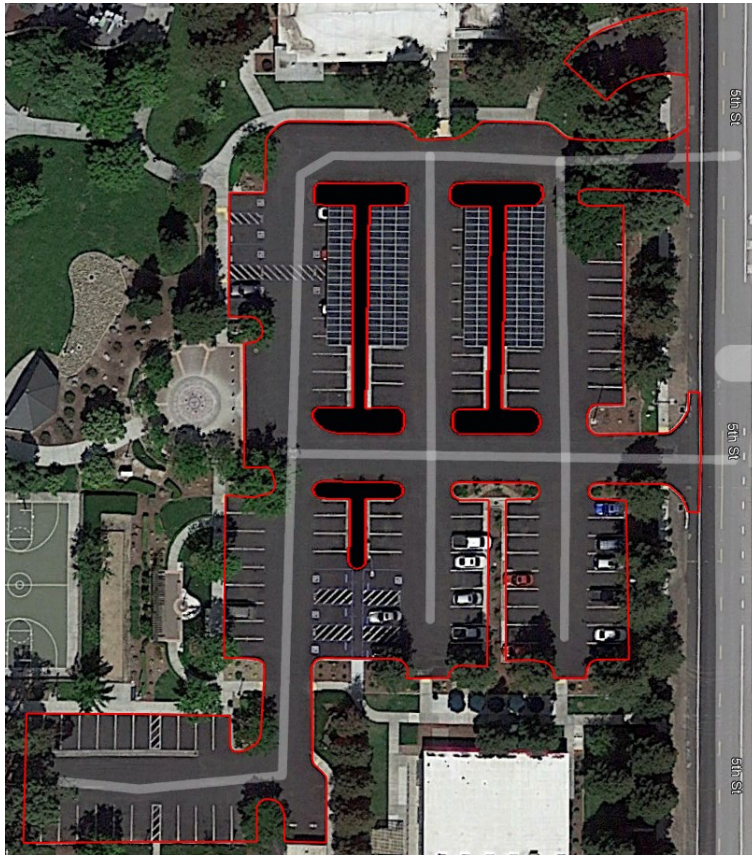

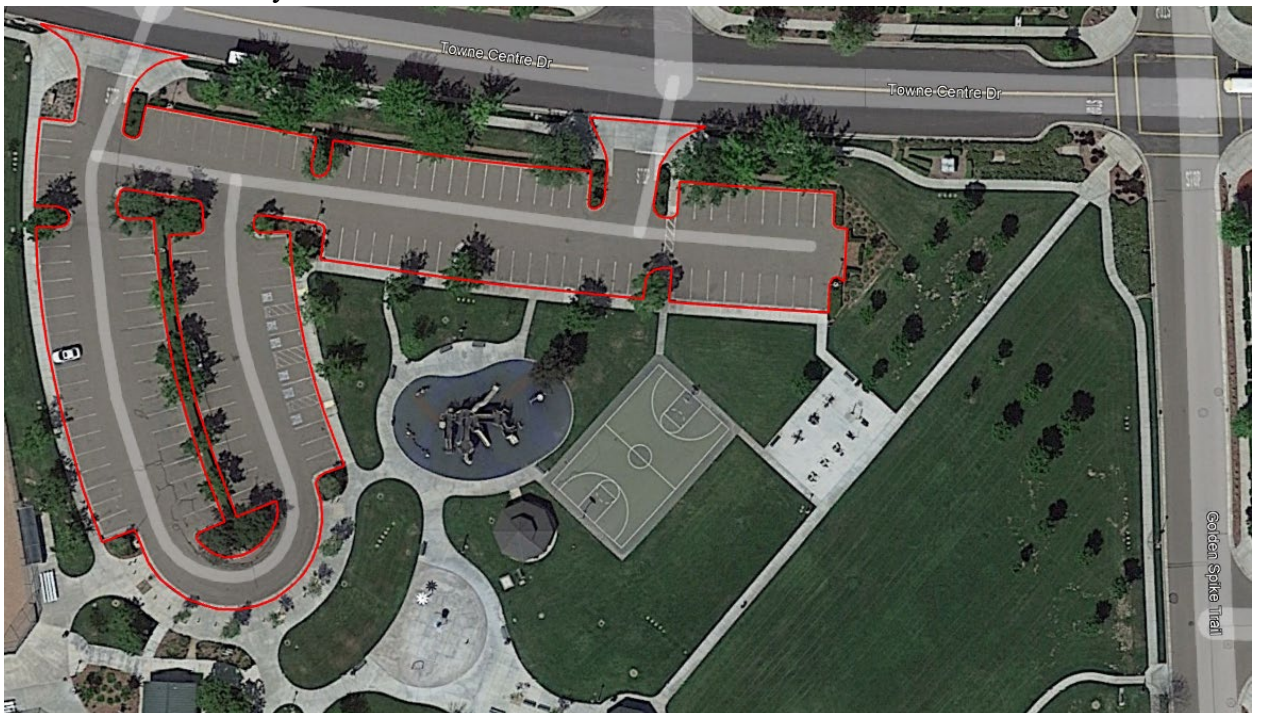

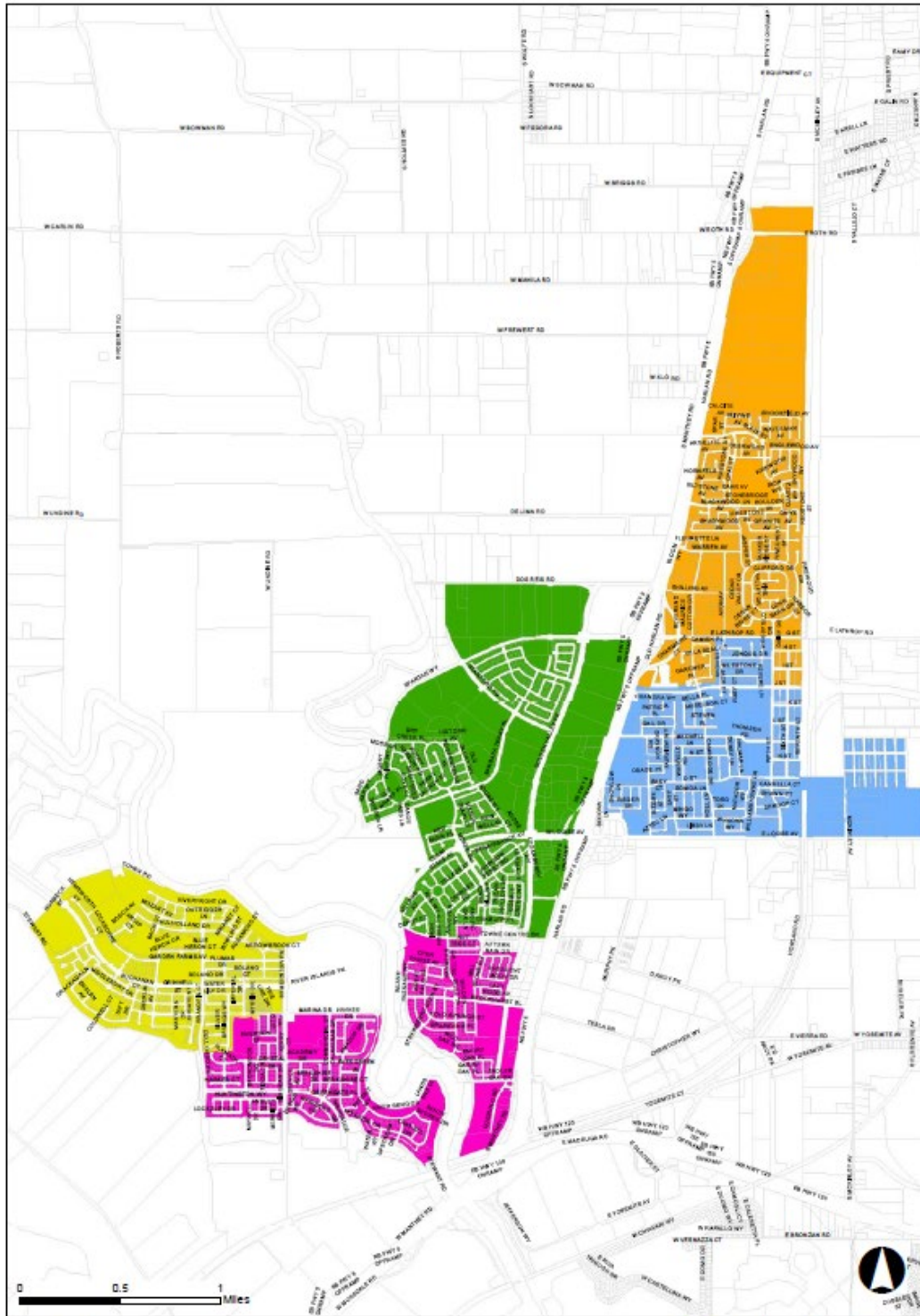
